

# Mob attacks Policemen for shooting dead robbery suspect

**O**SOGBO — A MOB yesterday attacked two policemen at Ikirun, Ogun State for shooting dead an armed robbery suspect.

The mob suspected foul play in the shooting.

The policemen are now on danger list at the Ladoke Akintola University of Technology (LAUTECH) Teaching Hospital, Osogbo.

A Mercedes Benz Car which the Police used to pursue the suspected robber was also torched by the irate mob.

Information on the incident was sketchy as at the time of filing this report but a source said the policemen were pursuing the deceased who boarded a commercial vehicle after he had allegedly robbed his victim of N30,000 at Iwoye area of Ijebu Jesha in Oriade Local government Area of the state.

The source added that the victim of the robbery incident, sought the assistance of the owner of the Mercedes Benz car in pursuing the robbery suspect who was in the commercial bus.

It was further learnt that when they got to Ibokun, the robbery victim solicited for the assistance of the police in pursuing the fleeing robbery suspect.

The fleeing robbery suspect however ran out of luck, said

the source, when on getting to Ikirun, the policemen caught up with them and opened fire on the suspect killing him instantly.

The mob who were oblivious of the incident however thought it was a case of extra judicial killing and descended on the policemen and were about to be set them ablaze before they were rescued by a detachment of policemen from Ikirun police station.

Confirming the incident, the Police Public Relations Officer, Joshua Olayemi, said the owner of the money allegedly stolen, Abiodun Olatunji has been arrested and is currently helping the police in their investigation.
