Enugu Speaker's aide shot dead

ENUGU— ONE of the se Curity aides to the Speaker of Enugu State House of Assembly, Corporal BenjaminNwajei, was shot dead by persons suspected to be armed robbers in Enugu yesterday morning. His AK 47 rife was taken away by the hoodlums.

The Mobile Police corporal was riding on a motorbike to his duty post at the Speaker's official residencein the Legislative quarters when the armed men driving in a vehicle bearing Federal Government's number plate knocked him down on Lagos Street in Asata area of the Coal City and shot him several times at close range with a pump action rifle.

Sources told Vanguard that Corporal Nwajei, who was a native of Delta State, had left the Central PoliceStation (CPS) barracks at about Sa.m. on his motorbike to join his other colleagues at the Speaker's quarterspreparatory to a scheduled tour to Nsukka that morning but he could not get to the quarters before the gunmen attacked.

"The armed men knocked him down with their car and before he knew what was happening, they openedfire on him. He was shot on the chest and all over his body. He fell down and bled to death. Residentsof the area ran for their lives when they heard gunshots but returned later only to see the mobile policeman lying in a pool of his blood," an eyewitness said.

Contacted, the Speaker, Chief Abel Chukwu, confirmed the report, saying he was in church when his wife came to inform him of the incident and he immediately rushed to thescene but did not meet the corpse as it was taken away by his colleagues from the Mopol 3, PMF, Enugu.

"It was a terrible thing. I saw a lot of blood on the ground and I could not imagine what happened. I immediately rushed to the Mobile Police barracks but I was told that his corpse had been deposited at the University of Nigeria Teaching Hospital (UNTH). I also went to the Commissioner of Police to inform him of the development," Chukwu said

He said he was to attend a function at Nsukka yesterday and had informed his security and personalaides the previous day to assembly at his quarters for the trip after the church service, but he had to putoff all engagements for the day. The Police Public Relations Officer, Mr. Mike Abattam, could not be reached for his comments on the development yesterday.
