

Mystery: Family of three found dead in Port Harcourt

PORT HARCOURT— THREE members of the family were found dead yesterday in their home in Port Harcourt.

Sources told the *Vanguard* that they were last seen on Tuesday.

"We were all here yesterday night. We saw them; they were all looking hail and hearty. But by this morning till about 9am they had not waken up. We later found that they had died. And quickly we alerted the necessary quarters. Nobody could say anything on the likely cause of the death.

When contacted the state Police PRO, Mrs. Baresua Ireju said she had heard but had not been thoroughly briefed.

It would be recalled that not something similar had hap-

pened in the state about two months ago when a family of

five died after their evening meal.

A SABA — AN acting Medical Director/Chief Executive officer has been appointed for the Federal Medical Centre (FMC) Asaba, following the recent shake up there as a result of panel investigation into some unwarranted deaths recorded in the hospital.

He is Dr. L.O. Erhumwunsee, a Consultant Pediatrician, who succeeds the immediate past holder of the office, Dr. Greg Eboh. Also appointed is Dr. (Mrs.) J.C. Udi, a Consultant Ophthalmologist, who had been how heads the Department of

Clinical Services.

A press statement signed by the Public Relations Officer (PRO), Mr. Nnamdi Ogbogu on behalf of the management of the hospital, yesterday in Asaba, stated that "the Board of Management of Federal Medical Centre, Asaba at its meeting of 30th - 31st October, 2006 has approved the appointment of Dr. L.O. Erhumwunsee-acting Medical Director/Chief Executive and Dr. Mrs. J.C. Udi, acting Head of Clinical Services".

The statement went on to say that "the Board has, in addition approved the appointment of three Consultants in Obstetrics and Gynaecology,
