Bandit killed in Ekpan

was killed and others seriously wounded during a cross fire between armed bandits and the police in Ekpan and Warri in Delta State on new year eve

Investigation revealed that some heavily armed bandits had on the fateful day burgled a store along the busy NNPC Housing complex road in Ekpan and started loading their "Ghana-must-go bag" which they took into the store.

It was gathered that the hoodlums had perfected their strategy to have a field day when they gained entrance into the store through a big hole which they dugged on the wall.

But nemesis caught up with

the criminals when information got to the Divisional Police officer(DPO) CSP Tony Ekong who was being honoured with an award by the Commissioner of police, Prince Udom Ekpoudom at Asaba who instructed his men to ensure the criminals are apprehended.

In a swift reaction, a patrol team stormed the scene and met the bad boys who were operating unhindered

Trouble started when the hoodlums on sighting the police team, went into the ceiling of the store and open fire on the law enforcement agents who were equal to the task.

During a cross fire from both sides, one of the bandits was hit by bullet from the police, while others escaped with bullet wounds. But the victim was taken to Ekpan General Hospital where he was confirmed dead.

Confirming the incident, Commissioner of Police, Prince Udom Ekpoudom said a lot of dangerous weapons including the guns used during the hot exchange of fire with the police were recovered from the deceased robber.

Ekpoudom reiterated the state police command efforts at reducing robbery incident to the bearest minimum and promised hell for bandits who do not wnat to leave Delta State alone.

Meanwhile the police in Warri during the yuletide season arrested a notorious criminal named Kelly Rotimi who confessed as being the mastermind of series of robbery incidents in the oil city.

Divisonal Police Officer (DPO) Warri, SP Christ Okóro who got a distress call that some armed bandits were operating along cemetery road Warri, led a crack team of detectives to dislodge the nefarious activities of the hoodlums, who also attempted to snatch a motor cycle from its owner
