yesterday in Bauchi that the teacher was attacked by some political thugs who apparently mistook him for a police officer. Guga said that the thugs, armed with clubs and machetes, beat the man to death at the Nasarawa-Jahun quarters in the Bauchi metropolis. He said that the corpse of the deceased had been deposited at the mortuary of the Bauchi

He, however, denied the speculations that the deceased was a police officer, saying that investigations into the incident were still ongoing.
