Wailing had hardly died down in Port Harcourt when report filtered in again of about thirty houses that were razed down in D line. The cause could not be immediately ascertained but Vanguard gathered that the inferno, which occurred in the early hours of yesterday, consumed an eight-month-old baby. The parents of the child reportedly escaped death but they sustained several degrees of burnt.

About thirty houses located on the thickly populated Egelege Street were reportedly affected. When Vanguard visited the scene some of the victims were still seen trying to gather what was left from

the debris.
