Three more bodies recovered from collapsed Lagos building

LAGOS—THREE more bodies were yesterday recovered from the debris of a collapsed building at 33 Egerton Street in Oke Arin area of central Lagos which occurred last Saturday at about 1.p.m. As at the time of the incident many people were believed to have been trapped in the debris of the three-story building.

The state governor Mr Babatunde Fashola who cut short his other engagements to visit the

site of the incident noted that the narrow streets and general inaccessibility to the site made rescue operation difficult. He insisted that every effort would be made to ensure that help reached those who were trapped within the shortest possible time.

Fashola said medical personnel including doctors, nurses and officials of the Lagos State Ambulance Services, Red Cross and other groups had been mobilised to offer assistance.
