Akala's convoy rescues accident victims along Lagos-Ibadan Road

BADAN—MANY lives were yesterday saved by the convoy of the Oyo State Governor, Otunba Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala when he rescued accident victims along Lagos-Ibadan Express Way.

The accident which occurred at Remo, Ogun State involved a 14-Seater bus which somersaulted several times when one of the front tyres came off on high speed.

The accident victims were rescued by personal aides to Governor Akala led by his personal Physician, Dr. Olayinka Adesola, the Deputy Chief of Staff, Alhaji Gbadegesin Rasak and the Special Assistant to the Governor on Protocol, Mrs. Wande Eyinove.

The victims were conveyed in the governor's vehicle to Isara General Hospital and the Road Safety Accident Clinic, Shagamu where they are currently receiving treatment.

The Oyo State Governor, Otunba Christopher Adebayo Alao-Akala who was intimated of the incident while on official engagement in Lagos, immediately directed that all efforts must be made to safe the lives of the victims.

A man was confirmed dead on the spot of the accident

while another lady died after a spirited battle by the Governor's personal Physician, Dr. Adesola to safe her life on the way to the hospital failed.

According to eye-witness, the ill-fated Ekiti-bound bus left Lagos yesterday morning.

Boarding house must for SSS 2&3 students in Ekiti

ADO-EKITI—It is now a must for students in the last two years at the Senior Secondary Schools (SSS) level in Ekiti State to be in boarding house, just as the state government has assured that no student from the University of Ado Ekiti would be forced to transfer his study to the newly established University of Education at Ikere Ekiti.

Briefing newsmen during

the weekly executive meeting in Ado Ekiti on Wednesday, the state commissioner for Education and Technology, Mrs Abiola Alimoshe said the policy was geared at improving standard of education in the state.

The commissioner said the policy would for now be implemented in nine schools, while the state government has according to her, approved the sum of N57million for the immediate take-off of the programme.
