According to eye witnesses, Oderinde's residence at 11. Kareem St. Atan Kekere was among the buildings affected by flood in the area due to the downpour penultimate Saturday and, as a result, there was power outage in the area. He was to return to campus, last Monday, and was already on his way when power was returned to the area. As a result, he went back to remove his CD from the player and before he could do that, decided to change the power phase to another that supplied normal supply.

While doing this, nobody could explain what happened, he just fell-and before neighbours could rush to the scene, he was stone dead. He was buried in the evening while the incident has sent his parents packing from the area. Meanwhile, an unidentified corpse was found in an uncompleted soakaway pit in the early hours of Friday along Bada Road in Ayobo. Residents of the area were still battling to bring it out at the time of filing.
