Robbers on rampage in Adamawa

RMED bandits number ing about 20 have laid siege on Mubi, the commercial nerve centre of Adamawa State. No fewer than three commercial banks were robbed and cash worth millions of naira carted away by the armed robbers.

Announcing the robbery incident in Yola, weekend, the state commissioner of police Mr. Aloy Okorie, said the rampaging robbers were, however, not all that lucky as five of them were killed while seven others were arrested in a shootout with the police.

He added that the slain bandits included a serving mobile police sergeant while the number of civilian casualities arising from the sporadic shooting of the armed robbers could as yet not be ascertained. But, reports from Mubi have it that more than 30 persons were receiving treatment at various hospitals in the town from injuries sustained as a result of stray bullets.

Giving a vivid account of the robbery incident, Okorie said the robbers stormed the two banks simultaneously in five vehicles in a daylight robbery. He added while the robbery was in progress, the police in the area through their

GSM sets started alerting surrounding divisional police stations.

"The divisional police stations along the Yola-Biu-Maiduguri road where the robbers were fleeing through were alive to their responsibilities, mobilised and matched fire for fire with the hoodlums and in the process two of the fleeing robbers were gunned down", he stated..

He added that as the robbers were moving towards Maiduguri, divisional police stations in Biu, Damboa and others along the highway equally mobilized their officers and the joint operations with officers of the Adamawa State police command pursuing the bandits yielded fruitful results, leading to the killing of five while others fled.

The police boss further confirmed that some of the fled hoodlums were later arrested at the Maiduguri Motor Park where they gathered to board a commercial vehicle with their loot to various destinations.
