Man, family escape death, as police kill colleague

WARRI—MANAGING Director of Afrofex International Marine Services Limited in Delta State, Alaowei Alfred Biukeme and members of his family escaped death, last weekend, when a gang of eight armed robbers dug a whole through the fence of his guest house in Ekpan, and invaded the house in a bid to kill him.

But a Police Sergeant from Fugar in Edo State, Sergeant Jafaru, attached to the antirobbery squad of the "A" Division of the Nigeria Police in Warri, was not lucky as he was shot dead by his colleague a Corporal following a heated argument over an ar-rested robbery suspect. Narrating his ordeal to

newsmen in Warri, Alaowei Biukeme said he was jolted from his sleep at about 12.45 am by the bandits who fired gunshots to scare away neighbours when they en-

tered the house.

It was gathered, however, that the bandits took to their heels when they suspected that some people in the neighborhood had contacted the police on phone. Alaowei Biukeme who described his escape and that of his family as miraculous said he had re ported the matter at the Ekpan Police Station, Ekpan.

Meanwhile, the trigger-hap py policeman that shot dead his colleague has been allegedly arrested and detained while homicide detectives from the Delta State Police Command have taken over the matter.

Three family **\(\square\$** members killed in auto crash

SABA-IT was all tears at Emuhu community in Ika South local government area of Delta State weekend following a ghastly accident that claimed the lives of a mother, her son and another relation of theirs

Vanguard gathered that the victims who were on a motorcycle were returning from a wedding ceremony at a nearby village to Emuhu when a fast moving car coming from Asaba end of the expressway knocked them down, killing all of them on the spot.

Family sources gave the names of the victims as Theresa Iyegbuye, 48 years, his son, Master Chibuzor and another relation, Mrs. Victoria Okonye, adding that Chibuzor was called to come and pick them up with the motorcycle at the close of the ceremony.

Eyewitness stated that "the driver of the car after hitting the motorcycle had tried to stop but on sighting the se-vere extent of the accident, he zoomed off probably to avoid

being lynched".

Delta House bans sale of hand books in tertiary institutions

ASABA—THE Delta State House of Assembly's Committee on Education has banned the printing and sale of academic handbooks in all the

state's tertiary institutions.
At a budget defence meeting in Asaba, the committee's Chairman, Mr. Victor Ochei, said that it was cheaper for the institu-tions to create websites instead

of printing handbooks.
Ochei advised that the state's tertiary institutions to set up their websites so as to enable the students to source information

from the sites.

He said that the students would be able to get up-to-date information that would enhance

their learning from the web. Ochei, however, warned that the committee would cut down on all unnecessary spending, saying: "it is no longer business as usual." He also expressed dissatisfaction over the poor management of the three government-

owned polytechnics in the state.
Ochei particularly queried the management of Ozoro Polytech-nic for spending N12 million on its Governing Council's meeting

He consequently requested for the details of those who signed for the money and other relevant documents, warning that the polytechnic might not receive any allocation for this year without the documents.
