

Expatriate found dead in his cabin

PORT HARCOURT—
STEVE DEGERSTROM,
an American was allegedly found
dead in a vessel that anchored at
Onne Port Terminal in the early
hours of yesterday. Those who
spoke to the Vanguard said the
vessel had been there for
sometime.

Confirming the painful
development, spokesman of the
Joint Task Force and army PRO
in the state, Lieutenant Col Sagi
Musa said the security body got
to know of the incident in the
early hours of yesterday.
According to him, there was no
clue to the cause of the death at
press time. "We have received
report that an American national
died last night inside a cabin of a
vessel anchored at Onne Port. "

The expatriate was a senior
staff of a shipping firm, Joan
Chouest. Some who spoke under
condition of anonymity said
they had to break into his cabin
when they became very
uncomfortable with the length of
time he was spending in his
sleep. They continued that he
was a very dutiful staff of the
firm and disciplined.

"Degerstrom was found dead
inside his cabin this morning.
Nobody knows what happened.
He might have died in his sleep.
He went to bed without any
complain yesterday."
