Robbers kill Benue varsity teacher

AKURDI—AN armed gang, numbering about 20, Monday night stormed the home of Mr. David Yongo, a lecturer in the history department of Benue State University, killing his wife in cold blood even as they shot his three year-old son.

Narrating the incident, Yongo who looked dumbfounded and in deep shock stated that he was at home with his family at his Gboko Road residence when at about 11pm a group of suspected assassins stormed his residence and started shooting sporadically into his house.

It was in the midst of the confusion that his wife, Mrs. Lauretta Yongo, a graduate of UNN and teacher at the Government Model Secondary school in Makurdi, and children, dashed out of the house in a bid to find cover

that the assailants shot her thrice below the abdomen.

His three year-old son was not spared, as he was also shot on the ankle and is presently lying critically ill at the Federal Medical Centre Makurdi, where frantic efforts are being made by a team of Doctors to save his life.

Dr. Yongo, who escaped death by the whiskers, maintained that from the way the assassins stormed his home, they were on a mission to eliminate his household, saying that he came to the conclusion based on the enormity of the attack.

"The gang stormed my house on a mission to eliminate me and my family, though my neighbours were attacked but their concentration was on me and my family and they succeeded in killing my wife; this is too much for me to bear. What did I and my family do to warrant this," Yongo queried rhetorically.

Married to his late wife of Enugu state extraction six years ago, the bereaved opined "she is a wife who had not only been a wife but also a friend, sister and confidant; how can I carry on without her. why?"

Meanwhile the matter has been reported to the police who said they are currently investigating it.

Six die in road crash near Lokoja
