Woman, two grandchildren burnt to death in Bayelsa

struck yesterday at Akaba munity some distance away men a 55-year-old woman and ser two grandchildren were masted to death following mewed cult clash.

The deceased woman sentified as Emilia Awudu and last grandchildren aged between as and six were said to have seen locked inside their home by warring cultists who poured their on them and set them ablaze wer the alleged sins of her son, shown as Bobo, said to belong a rival cult group.

The incident, which occurred around 7pm on Saturday, left freee houses burnt down, while cany others were destroyed.

Also the house belonging to a wimming coach with the State sports Council, Mr. Preye mith-Apatu, and that of one borueitein Okpotolomo were

vandalised during the rampage.

It was learnt that attempts by some members of the community to sought the help of the soldiers stationed close to Julius Berger yard in the neighbourhood proved abortive as security men were said to have closed an hour before the attack.

Some members of the community, who spoke anonymously, confirmed that the cultists were dressed in all white regalia and armed with sophisticated weapons with which they attacked anyone found in the community.

Speaking on the sad development, the paramount ruler of the community, H.R.H David Alfred, said the suspected cultist were said to have attended a wake-up in a neighbouring village and invaded the community with calls for indigenes to produce the son of the deceased woman and the president of the youths named Otavie Sakwe.
