Mother, child, four others killed in auto accident

BENIN—A woman and a child whose identities could not be ascertained were among six people that were killed Tuesday evening in motor accident involving a Toyota Hiace bus which occurred at the Benin Agbor Road. The other four victims were male passengers.

Eye witness account told *Vanguard* that the bus with registration number X 145 UWN was heading towards Agbor from Benin when one of its tyres pulled out at top speed at the busy highway when the accident occurred.

However, the Zonal Commander of the FRSC, Ndah Zakari who confirmed the incident said that apart from those who died, eight others

made up of four males and females respectively were injured.

The FRSC Zonal Commander said that the corpses of the victims had been taken to the Central Hospital, Agbor, Delta State where the injured were also said to be rushed to, for urgent medical attention.

Zakari stated that items recovered from the scene of the accident were with the police who according to him arrive the scene of the accident before the arrival of his men.

Meanwhile, the men of the FRSC had recovered the corpse of one Alaba Joseph, from the Ekhakpamre River along the Warrii Benin Road whose light green Mazda car plunged into the river at Agbarho on Sunday.

Police gun down eight bullion van robbers in Port Harcourt

PORT HARCOURT — suspected robbers were gunned down yesterday by men of the Rivers State Police Command during an attempt to raid a bullion van belonging to a new generation bank, in Port Harcourt.

Briefing newsmen on the incident. the commissioner for Police, Mr. Balla Hassan said following a phone call a team of crack detectives from the state anti robbery and operation squad stormed the area. They saw the underworld men numbering about 15 on motor bikes. The hoodlums sensing danger sped off but were given a hot chase by the security operatives. According to the commissioner, the fleeing robbers opened fire several times on his men before running into a mangrove so appoint me casters me pass area of the state capital.

The police men, the commissioner, said followed them. And in an ensuing gun battle eight of them were killed while two were arrested. Mr. Balla said three locally made pistols, five magazines, nine handsets:

wraps of substance suspected to be cocaine were among things recovered from them.

The shooting which started at about 8.20 on the Nwaja Bridge, overlooking, the railway flyover bridge and the Elekohia Junction, sparked a pandemonium, forcing motorists, commercial cyclists and other commuters to flee for cover.

ENAGOA— SEVERAL homes were yesterday sacked following a downpour in Yenagoa the Bayelsa State capital.

Though the wet season is gradually come to an end in most parts of the country but the situation appears to be different in Bayelsa which falls within the rain belt where heavy downpour is being experienced daily.

The worst affected areas during yesterday storm include Onopa which is some distance away from the Government House, Amarata, Ovom, Ekeki, Okaka, Yenizue-Gene and Biogbolo among others all of which are low and marshy lend.

Most civil servants residing in these flood prone areas were forced to rush home on noticing the gathering storm at about noon ostensibly to salvage what they could from the anticipated flood

As at the time of filing this report most landlords including

hoteliers were using motorized pumping machine to expel flood water from their premises.

Although Yenagoa the state capital is predominantly a low marshy land with several adjoining canals which could have served as natural drainages but many of these natural drainages have been turned into refuse dump by residents while land developers have also blocked right of way of the canals making free movement of water impossible

Also most of the roads recently constructed by the state government were done without any environmental impact assessment with the result that many do not have drainages whose those with drainages do not flow into the canal discrety causing flooding and anguish to residents.

Some buildings on Imgbi road in the heart of the capital city where most of the national dailies have their offices were completely submerged with the residents battling to salvage their valuables from the flood.—
