JTF kills 3 suspected kidnappers of Lebanese in Ekpan

WARRI—THE Three suspected militants who kidnapped a Lebanese in Ekpan area of Effurun in Delta State in the early hours of Tuesday have been killed by security agents.

The suspects were mowed down allegedly to send a stern warning to their ilks who might want to disrupt the relative peace that pervades the oil rich state. Nemesis caught up with the suspects barely two hours after they abducted a Lebanese, Jack Farees, working with a construction firm, Niger Cat Nigeria Limited at Ekpan area of Effurun.

An AK-47 rifle, a pump action shotgun and several unspent cartridges were recovered from the suspects identified as Kingsley Obodo, 33 years; Collins Godfrey, and Yinkore Dengha aged 37 years but the fourth and sponsor of the kidnap simply identified as Labando narrowly escaped the security dragnet.

Security sources disclosed that the suspects were picked up by a combined team of troops from Joint Task Force (JTF), the police, the special security outfit of the state and some youths at nearby Okuokoko village, in Okpe local government area where they hid their victim. Mr. Farees who was working on the multi billion Naira PTI-Ekpan dualisation project at the time of his kidnap, said that four youths accosted him, covered his face and took him away to an unknown destination.

Governor Emmanuel Uduaghan described the incident as unfortunate but that all security machinery already put in place in the state were used to secure the release of the foreigner and the arrest of the suspects.

He, however, expressed regret that the sponsor of the kidnappers who arrived Warri from Lagos on board an Aero Contractor airline narrowly escaped arrest, adding that the whole act was plotted in Lagos and "the sponsor flew into Osubi believing that his boys must have completed theassignment".

Coordinator of the Joint Media Campaign Centre of JTF, Colonel Rabe Abubakar, confirmed the arrest of the suspects and liberation of their victim but was silent on the execution of the kidnappers.
