## Monarch denies murder allegation

HRH EZE Godsaveus Mba of Umunchi autonomous community in Imo state has described as false and malicious, recent reports carried by the media including Vanguard on the murder of Chief Sab Opara, former President General of Umunchi Town Union and Proprietor of Sab Supermarket in Aba, Abia state, saying that the report portrayed him (Eze Mba) in bad light.
