Nigerians urged to embrace tree planting

As the effects of global warming become more glaring, Nigerians have been enjoined to embrace tree planting to reduce the consequence of

greenhouse gases.

This advice was given in Lagos by the Managing Director of Ifineon Nigeria Limited, Mr. Ugo Onyeama. He pointed out that trees are very useful in reducing carbon-dioxide and carbon-monoxide, two ontributors to greenhouse gases and replenishing

Accident claims one, others injured

By Ifeanyin Okolie TEARS flowed freely when a yet-to-be identified middle aged woman returning from church met her untimely death at the front of Fagbems Fillings Station close to Cele Bus-Stop along the Oshodi-Apapa Express-

ay. The woman w The woman was a victim of an auto accident that involving a blue coloured Man Diesel trailer truck marked XJ 94 KTU carrying heavy duty metal goods and a DAF tanker truck that was parked at the front of the filling station.

An eye witness account said the accident

An eye witness account said the accident occurred at about 4pm when the trailer truck which was being driven at high speed by a yet-to-be identified male driver lost control, after one of its tires burst and it veered off its lane and headed for the DAF tanker truck parked at the other side of the road.

The eyewitness who simply identified himself as Kolawole, an auto mechanic, said the woman who was walking along the pedestrian lane, ran for her dear life when she saw the rickety trailer approaching, but she was not fast enough as the truck smashed her against the tanker truck.

However, when Vanguard Metro got to the scene sympathiser were seen weeping, while the driver of the truck was lying helplessly on the ground.

Some sympathisers also lamented over the fact that the victim could have been saved if she had received medical attention immedi-ately. According to them, the woman was still breathing when she was rescued.
