Police in Kaduna arrest man for killing two sons

THREE persons, including two brothers have been arrested by the Kaduna state police command for allegedly beheading a 28-year-old man and dumping his headless body in a well.

Police sources told Crime Alert that the suspects who were simply identified as Joshua, Tanko and Samuel were picked up at Kasua village in the state following a tip-off last week from some villagers who believed that the suspects had enough to tell security operatives about their involvement in the death of the deceased whose name was given as Sunday Musa.

However, the arrest of the suspects is coming on the heels of a another report

that a teenage girl who was impregnated by a district head in Brinin-Gwari local government of the state dumped her new born baby in the bush over her alleged inability to shoulder the responsibilities of a mother.

It was learnt that Musa had been missing for some days before some villagers discovered his headless body floating inside a well and alerted the village head of Kasua, who in turn invited the police to the scene of the incident.

Also, a Fulani man whose name given as Mallam Sule was said to have gone berserk and killed two of his children but was promptly arrested by the police in the state.

The names of the children were given as Memuna Adamu, aged 9years and Mahad, a seven-year-old

girl.

"We arrested several suspects for various offences including murder, and dumping an innocent child in the bush. Three suspects were arrested for allegedly killing their friend in Kasua village while a teenage girl was picked up from Birin Gwari for allegedly dumping her child following the reported refusal of the traditional ruler of the area who impregnated her to carter for the child.

"We also have in our custody, a middle-aged Fulani man who killed two of his children. We are in the process of completing investigations on all these cases, after which the suspects will be charged to court for their offences", a police officer who spoke on the condition of anonymity said.
