Chieftaincy tussle claims 1, monarch, 5 others in police net

ENUGU—THE traditional ruler of Amechi
Idodo in Nkanu East Local
Government Area of Enugu
State, Igwe Joseph Ngene,
and five other natives of the
community, have been arrested over the chieftaincy
tussle that led to a bloody
clash which claimed one life
and property worth millions
of Naira yesterday.

The victim, whose identity could not be ascertained at press time, was allegedly killed by supporters of the royal father during a fight with some natives opposed to his selection as *Igwe* of the autonomous community

Protests

Hundreds of people from the community had recently staged a protest march to Government House, Enugu, urging Governor Sullivan Chime to intervene in the matter and withdraw the certificate of recognition issued to the traditional ruler allegedly without a formal election and due process.

Death, burning, Igwe's arrest

Sources said the simmering dispute between supporters of the embattled *Igwe* and those opposed to him escalated after the protest to Government House, leading to the fight that ensued, yesterday, where a member of the opposing camp was allegedly killed.

Angered by the development, some youths in the community set three houses, including that of the traditional ruler, ablaze and reportedly vowed to sack
