It was learnt that as soon as the exercise took off, there was violence and in the process, a vehicle was shot and the driver died on the spot while three other

Apart from the person, who was killed during the violence, which rocked the membership registration, a stray bullet was said to have hit a school girl at Ora village, just as three other persons, who sustained various injuries during the fracas are still receiving treatment at an undisclosed hospitals.
