# Suspected robbers kill 2 policemen, seize 3 rifles

 $\mathbf{A} \cdot \mathbf{G} \cdot \mathbf{O} \cdot \mathbf{S} - \mathbf{T} \cdot \mathbf{W} \cdot \mathbf{O}$ policemen attached to Owutu Police Division in Ikorodu West Local Council Development Area of Lagos, have been shot dead by robbers.

The no fewer than five robbers also made-away with three rifles to the belonging policemen.

The policemen, it was gathered, were on a stop and search routine job at Agric bus-stop, when they were attacked at about 11pm, Tuesday.

Eye witnesses said the policemen had flagged down a Murano jeep and directed the driver to put on his inner light. Unknown to them, the occupants of the vehicle, were suspected members of a robbery gang, who had earlier snatched two vehicles from their owners.

Other members of the gang reportedly drove in a Toyota Camry car, which was directly behind the jeep.
