Suspected assassins kill bizman in Osun



It was learnt that efforts by the late Ajayi and his household to get police assistance proved abortive as the assailants shot sporadically into the air, scaring away neighbours.

The incident however, threw the community into pandemonium as youths in the town protested the killing of Ajayi who they described as a "philanthropist and lover of his people."

A family source told Vanguard that the deceased was not involved in politics or any controversial matter that could warrant such death, describing the late community leader as "a quiet and easy going person."

The state Commissioner of Police, Mr. Olusegun Solomon who said he heard about the incident, however said his office had not been fully briefed.

He assured that the matter would be properly investigated and details of the police findings would be made known to the public in no distant time.
