YENAGOA— Bayelsa State Government, yesterday, said it will set up a task force to check the security challenges in the state.

Senior Special Assistant Media and Public Affairs to the Governor, Daniel Iworiso-Markson, in a statement, said "Upon further investigation, it was revealed that the other three persons who sustained serious injuries as a result of the cross-fire gave up


