District head, 9 others burnt as Nasarawa ethnic clashes persist

...over 50 houses destroyed

THE crisis that erupted on the early hours of Wednesday between Eggon and Migili ethnic nationalities in Agyaragu, headquarters of Jenkwe Development Area in Obi local government council of Nasarawa state entered its third day leaving the District head of Gidan Rail, Zhe Meri dead and was found in ashes when the state Deputy governor. Damishi Luka Barau led government state delegation to assess the level of damage caused by the incident amidst tight security.

Among the people burnt to ashes were two aged visually impaired women who despite their condition could not attract mercy from their attackers while they could not be whisked away by their relations when the militias who were carrying sophisticated weapons over powered them and set the house the victims

were hiding ablaze leaving them roasted.

Vanguard gathered that the District head who recently fled his ancestral domain in Gidan Rail in Ekye development area of Doma Local Government Council as a result of the on-going Fulani/Farmers crisis in the area and was taking refuge in Agyaragu finally met his death in the bloody attack.

Paramount ruler of Migili Chiefdom, Dr. Ayuba Agwadu whose palace was completely razed by the attackers had remained hostage in his home town in Musha and was later accompanied by armed Police men to Lafia, the state capital where he is taking refuge.

Our correspondent who was on the entourage of the state deputy governor observed that the attack which seems to have been well planned was targeted mostly at destroying the modern houses belonging to prominent persons in the community.

State deputy governor

DELTA State Governor, Dr. Emmanuel Uduaghan, on Thursday presented a budget proposal of N398.31billion for the 2013 fiscal year. Abreakdown of the figure shows that N145.94 is for recurrent expenditure while N252.37 is for capital expenditure. The 2013 budget is lower than this year's budget of N437.21 billion by N38.9billion.

Uduaghan however announced the setting up of what he described as a "self-evaluation process," appraise the performances of his commissioners. Presenting the budget, Governor Uduaghan said, "the reality of the need for us to build Delta State beyond oil is becoming more evident by the day. In the past few months, our oil revenue has dwindled drastically resulting in adopting

SUSPECTED kid-nappers in Warri, Delta State, have threatened to abduct Mr. Paul Bebenimibo, an activist and top adviser of ex-militant leader, Government Ekpemupolo, alias Tompolo.

The supposed kidnappers in a text message from a GSM line, O8153979335, to the activist, accused him of not releasing an undisclosed amount of money that Tompolo allegedly asked him to disburse to them.

They said he was giving them between N200 and N500 and vowed to abduct his wife and children if they failed to get him.

Speaking to Saturday Vanguard, the activist confirmed that he received the threat message from suspected kidnappers, saying, "I do know them and what they are saying is not true"
