Four die, scores injured in Ogun multiple auto crashes

ABEOKUTA — FOUR per-
sons lost their lives while
several others were critically in-
jured in two separate accidents
in Abeokuta, the Ogun State
capital and Ilaro in Yewa South
Local Government Area of the
state.

The first accident, yesterday
afternoon, involved members of
the Ahmadiyya Muslim Jammah,
who were returning to Abeokuta
after their three-day annual con-
gress in Ilaro.

Vanguard gathered that one of
the rear tyres of the bus convey-
ing members of the religious sect
burst while on high speed, which
caused the driver to lose control

of the bus. The bus, it was gath-
ered, somersaulted three times,
killing the driver on the spot.

When our correspondent vis-
ited the state hospital in Ijaye,
where the injured were being
treated, one of the injured said
the incident occurred shortly af-
ter the vehicle had left Ibese.

At press time, the exact causal-
ity figure remained uncertain, as
the dead and the injured were
still being conveyed to the hos-
pital.

Vanguard observed that offi-
cials of the hospitals hid the iden-
tity of the victims from their rela-
tives who besieged the hospital
to ascertain the state of health of
their loved ones.
