Man stabs mum to death in Mbaise

Disbelief, rage and confusion has gripped Amagbu autonomous community, a sleepy rural village in Ezinihitte Mbaise local council area, following what some people called "the gruesome murder of a woman, by her first son".

Vanguard investigations revealed that the middle aged woman, identified as Mrs. Ann Anyanwu, met her untimely death in the hands of her first son, Uzoma Anyanwu.

Although it was not very clear at press time what led to the ugly incident, it was however gathered that Mrs. Anyanwu was allegedly stabbed three times by Uzoma.

According to the third son of the late woman, Mr. Chukwudi Anyanwu, "the incident occurred in the morning, when everybody had left the family home for their respective businesses".

Continuing, Chukwudi said: "My father heard a voice he clearly identified as that of his wife, calling for help. The same voice was said she was dying. When he got there, he noticed that it was his first son that was inflicting the deadly stabs on the mother".

Answering another question, the traumatized Chukwudi said his father quickly reported the incident to the Chairman, adding he also heard people saying that "Uzoma has killed his mother", as he approached the family house.

He equally lamented that his mother died before any sort of assistance, including firs aid, could be administered.

Reacting also to the incident, the traditional ruler of Amagbu autonomous community, Eze Mike Ndudiri, who confirmed the incident, equally described it as "most unfortunate".

The royal father said that the matter had been handed over to the police for proper investigation.

"It is most unfortunate that this is happening in my domain. I quickly invited the Divisional Police Officer, DPO, to this place. The murderer has been taken away, while the corpse has been moved to a hospital mortuary", the royal father

said.

Efforts made to reach the Police Public Relations Officer, PPRO, Mr. Andrew Enwerem, for his comments failed but a police officer attached Ezinihitte Mbaise Police Division, who spoke on strict grounds of anonymity, confirmed the story.
