Banker crushed to death by BRT bus

A banker, Segun Ajisebutu, was yesterday crushed by a BRT bus at Palmgrove bus-stop, Lagos, while dashing across the BRT lane.

The incident reportedly occurred around 6am, under Palmgrove pedestrian bridge when the victim was going to his place of work, a new generation bank.

Segun was neatly dressed in shirt and trousers with a tie to match when he was knocked down on the Palmgrove/Jibowu axis of the BRT lane and he died on the spot.

The accident was said to have resulted in traffic gridlock which took over the BRT lane for hours until the arrival of law enforcement agents who restored normalcy.

The body was laid on the service lane where he was later identified through some documents found on him.

The development was also announced on a radio station where one of his relatives got wind of the situation and contacted other relatives.

One of the victim's relatives who identified himself as Lekan, told *Vanguard* in a telephone conversation: "He was a promising guy and I spoke with him on phone last Sunday when he gave me an assignment to be collected on Friday. It was sad to

Man docked over alleged \$30,000 fraud

LAGOS—A 47-year-old Lman, Abdullahi Ismaila Mubarak, has been arraigned before an Ikeja Magistrate Court for allegedly obtaining \$30,000 by false pretence.

The defendant, with no fixed address, is facing a three-count charge of obtaining and stealing preferred against him by the police.

The prosecutor, E.I. Nnamonu, ASP, told the court that the defendant committed the alleged offence on February 4, 2015, at Oke Odo pleasure, Abule-Egba, Lagos.

He said the defendant obtained the sum from

Segun, a father of two from Ondo State, was said to be in his early 30s when he met his untimely death and the body had been deposited in a morgue.

According to the presecutor, the offence is punishable under Section 312(a)(b) of the Criminal Laws of Lagos State of Nigeria 2011.

However, the defendant pleaded not guilty to the charge against him and Chief Magistrate A.O Komolafe granted him bail in the sum of N5,000,000, with two sureties who must show evidence of three years tax payment and a verifiable home address.
