ROBBERY: 6 set free over weak prosecution

CIX persons have regained freedom after an Ikeja High Court in Lagos dismissed a robbery charge brought against them, following the prosecution's failure to provide witness.

The six persons include Ismaila Bankole, 34; Akeem Ganiu, 30; Abass Ayanniyi, 31; Lukman Jimoh, 33; Lateef Amodu, Oluwaseun 28, and Soneye, 25.

The six persons, who had pleaded not guilty, were arraigned by Lagos State government on a two-count charge of robbery and possession of firearms without license.

At the resumed hearing, the prosecutor, Mrs Abiola Ajayi, informed the judge that she could not bring her witness to court.

Subsequently, Justice Jose dismissed the charge brought against the six persons and warned them not to return to commit robbery and be brought back to court.

Vanguard gathered that the deceased, accompanied by the pastor of the church, whose name was given as Simon, went into the church on Saturday evening to sweep and get the place ready for the next day's service, when it began to rain.

The pastor was said to have handed his mobile phone to the deceased for safe-keeping, while he went back to his house for his clothes.

The pastor, a source said, was held back in his house by the rain. When he came back to the church, the woman was on the floor dead. He then raised alarm.

"There was a lot of thunder and lightning during the brief rain fall and unfortunately, Mrs Yegwa was struck dead by one of those fierce lightenings No that hit the church," Tony, a source in the area, told Vanguard.

The church, which shares a fence with the edifice of Mr. John Odey, the former Minister of Environment, was pulled down by angry relatives of the woman, which stopped the church from holding services, yesterday.

The source said: "The relatives stormed the church soon after the incident and pulled it down. As I speak to

you, there is no church service going on there today, Sunday." The Police Public Relations Officer for Cross River State Command, Mr. Hogan Bassey, said he was yet to receive reports of the incident from the Divisional Police Officer for the area.
