Police launch manhunt for alleged tenant's killer

♠ WKA—ANAMBRA State Police Command has arrested a 27-year-old man (names withheld) from Umuohi Okija in Ihiala Local on the run and is being hunted Government Area for allegedly killing his step-brother during a fight.

When police visited the area, the deceased was allegedly found in a pool of his blood. His body was later deposited at by the police.

Elsewhere at Nkpor in Idemili North Local Government Area, a middle-aged man, Tochukwu Maduekwe, who allegedly murdered his father's tenant, is by police.
