

Four persons burnt to death as trucks collide in Anambra

FOUR persons were burnt to death in Awka, yesterday, as two collided along the Agu Awka end of the Enugu-

Onitsha expressway.

The crash took place at the same spot where a couple and their son were crushed to death two weeks ago.

The two vehicles were still in flames at about 8.00pm; even the staff from the nearby headquarters of the state Fire Service could not do much to stop the inferno.

Traffic came to a standstill and travelers were held at one spot for several hours.

The police and men of the Federal road Safety Commission, FRSC, were however seen trying to create space for vehicles to move.

It could not be ascertained immediately what caused the accident, but an eye witness said the trucks were on high speed and were going in opposite direction.
