Storm in Edo over death of pipeline fitter, Isaac Arhore

- Widow petitions AIG, demands investigation of husband's death

BENIN—THE strange death of a pipeline fitter and welder working at Safety 2000, a Benin-based company in Edo State, Mr. Issac Arhore, February 24, has ignited a controversy, following an allegation that both his employers and police were true up covering circumstances of his demise.

Widow of the deceased, a father of six children, Mrs. Kevwe Arhore, in a petition to the Assistant Inspector General of Police, AIG, Zone 5, Benin City, through the Human Rights Defenders Organization of Nigeria, HURDON, Warri, Delta State, claimed that a Divisional Police Officer, DPO, in Edo state offered her N1 million to forget

Visit to police station, mortuary
