LINGERING APAPA GRIDLOCK:

When driving against traffic is the only way

·Fatal 'one-way' accidents on the rise

MILD, but familiar Adrama played out to a Berger-Underbridge-bound Lagos commercial bus that took off from the Cele Bus-stop along the Oshodi-Apapa Expressway. Instead of heading in what one of the passengers considered the right direction relative to the loudly announced destination, the driver had taken the overhead bridge and was soon driving against the traffic in the opposite direction of the road. And almost immediately, the female passenger had raised an alarm.

"Heb driver, is it not Mile Two this bus is going?" she demanded in a ponicky voice. And when the conductor assured her that the bus was indeed heading to Mile Two, she had beatedly queried. Then why are you driving on this nide of the road? Or don't you know that driving 'One-Way' is dangerous?"

And the driver was quick to explain thus. "Madam, it's because of hold up. Don't you know that the whole road from Second Rainbow to Mile Two and Coconut is blocked? There's no movement at all because trailers and tankers have blocked everywhere."

Some of passengers supported the driver by saying it was inevitable to drive against the traffic given the prevailing gridlock. But the woman was not impressed, insisting that it was unsafe to drive against the traffic. And she has her musons.

"If you people happen to know the number of persons that have been knocked down and killed by vehicles driving 'one-way' you will not be supporting the driver. I personally witnessed two incidents like that on this road.

Th one case, a woman crossing the road at Sanya Bus stop was knocked down by a donlo bus that was driving one way. She died on the spot. And just last week, another person, a woung man, was killed near jiesha as he was bying to cross to the other side of the road. And guess whalf It was another donlo driving eneway that was responsible.

'And there are many other cases like that. So, when you consider these fatal accidents, why will anybody still want to support or encourage the drivers of these buses to be driving one-way even if there's traffic jam on the road?" Indeed the lingering gridlock along the Mile Two/Apapa axis of the Oshodi Apapa Expressway created by a stege of articulated heavy duty vehicles and failed sections of the road seem to have left many motorists, especially commercial bus drivers, with no choice but to drive against the traffic from Cele busstop to Berger Under bridge (outward Apapa). In fact, most of them feel justified that it is the only way to beat the traffic if you must get to your destination on time. Also, most clearing and forwarting agents as well as those whose places of work are situated in Apapa, have taken to mounting readily available

motorbikes to and from their destinations in that axis

And the fact that the relevant authorities, including security and traffic regulating agencies, did not for a long time move against commercial vehicle operators taking this accident-prone alternative seems to minforce the popular impression that the law against one-way driving has been suspended pending when the traffic situation

Unfortunately, the cost in lives has been high, especially for motorbike riders plying the expressway. While some of them are presently confined to their sick beds with severe injuries, others did not live to tell their story after being knocked down and their skulls smashed by fast moving trucks.

Bitter takes of victims families are now bitterly counting their losses on account of this traylic developments. Vanguard Spotlight met with three separate families who claimed their loved ones were knocked down by mekless motorists driving against the traffic.

One of them Alhaja Mulikat Opaments said her younger sater. Adonn, had been under medical observation for the past three years due to the injuries unitained after she was knocked down by a commercial motorcyclist. She was a factory worker at Warehouse Bus-stop and was returning home on that tateful Tuesday when she was knocked down by a commercial motorcyclist at Mile 2 Oke. This affected her limbs. She has since been confined to a wheel chair," the lamented.

The case of the Aighous family from Exporna, Edo State is worse as they lost the mother of the house in a one-way related actident that also left their 12-year-old grandson hospitalised.

The head of the family, Mr. Sunday Aigboas, who is still mourning the tragic loss of his write, informed that the incident happened precisely on March 14, 2018 at Sanya flus-stop while she was on her way home from Sanya market where she was a perty trader.

She was said to have left Sanya Market at about 7 30pm and was in her way home at about 7 30pm when she was knocked down by a list and run motionst which left her legs broken and her grandson senously injured. Unfortunately Dorcas died while sympathisers were taking them to bospital Meantime, the grandson is still in the Intensive Care Unit where he is undergoing medical

The 59 years old Dorcas was interfed on May 5 in her home town, according to family sources. in a chat with Vanguard, the widower Mr. Aighous, said his wate wdeath has left a vacuum in the family. He said: "My waterdied shortly after leaving the market. She was holding our grandson to link the street beside the popular white gament church at Sarrya Bus-stop, to Coken/Orile. when she was knocked down. She died on the way to the bospital but our grandson survived the accident though with severe insuries."

He also informed that the late Dorcas, a mother of seven, was said to be a peace loving trader and some of her co-inders and associates described her as a gentle and hantworking trades. To be concluded
