Spillover from war over inheritance:

Man stabs 2 siblings dead over TV channels in Delta

Asaba, Delta State capital, after a young man stabbed two of his younger brothers to death for not allowing him to watch preferred channel on DSTV.

While one of the victims, identified as Kingsley Nwani, was said to have died on the spot, the second victim, whose name was not known at press time, died at the hospital where he was rushed to.

The suspected assailant was said to have disappeared into

thin air after committing the crime.

Vanguard gathered that the mother of the children owns a petrol station on Summit Road in Asaba metropolis, which was managed by the late Kingsley Nwani. It was under lock and key when Vanguard visited.

Meanwhile, another source close to the family alleged that the trio had been fighting over property owned by their parents.

The source, who pleaded anonymity, said: "Ever since their father died, the brothers have been fighting over properties, especially the filling station. "Kingsley has been the one running it and their mum loves the two younger brothers and favours them more than the elder one.

"So when the eldest noticed that he was losing out, he killed both of them yesterday with knife by cutting their necks. Kingsley died immediately, while the other brother was rushed to the hospital and died also."

Efforts to reach the Police Public Relations Officer in the state Police Command, DSP Andrew Aniamaka, proved abortive at press time.
