Cultists kill 6 students at Ekpoma varsity graduation p

BENIN—TENSION mounts
the university town of
Ekpoma, Esan West Local
Government Area of Edo State,
following the killing of no fewer
than six students of Ambrose Alli
University by suspected cultists.

An unconfirmed report, yesterday in Benin, disclosed that the students were killed at a graduation party at Ihunmudumun quarters of the town, by persons suspected to be secret cult members.

Vanguard gathered that the target of the gunmen escaped and in anger they shot at those sitting by him including his girlfriend, who was said to have come to celebrate his graduation with him from Katsina State, where she is undergoing the mandatory National Youth Service Corps, NYSC, scheme.

A reprisal attack, yesterday, led to the killing of one person whose body was found in a well, but it is yet to be confirmed which cult groups were involved in the killings.

Meanwhile, the school has concluded its second semester examinations.

The casualties

Three of the dead persons were former students of the institution, invited to the graduation party, while others just concluded their final examinations.

A source in the local government said the dead were four males and one female, while two others were critically injured.

Among the dead were a final year medical student known as Dr. Chibudum Einstein, and a postgraduate student identified as Ose Abulu, said to be the son of a former chairman of the local government.

It was gathered that the suspected killer is a student that earlier fought with another student at the party venue and was said to have angrily walked out after his shirt got torn, but returned with his friends to commit the havoc.

A professor in the university, who pleaded anonymity, confirmed the incident but said it happened outside the campus.

Vanguard gathered that the shooting occurred in a nearby bar operated by an ex-banker (name withheld), where the victims relocated to after the altercation at the party.

Dean of Student Affairs reacts

However, Dean of Students Affairs of the university, Professor Don Akhilomen, told Vanguard in an interview that although the shooting incident did not happen within the institution's campuses, the authorities were yet to identify

those that were killed.

He said: "We heard that some people were killed at Ihunmudumun area of the town, while at a graduation party. We are yet to identify those involved. Some may be our students, some might not be. So, we are still watching the situation."

Train crushes policem motorcyclist in Lagos

A police officer identified as Inspector Philip Kolo, and a yet-to-be identified commercial motorcyclist were, yesterday, moming crushed to death by a train at PWD Bus Stop, Ikeja, Lagos.

It was learned that the okadaman sighted the train, which was en route ljoko, Ogun State, but in an attempt to navigate the rail track in a hurry, his meterbike got stuck and the train met them.

When Vanguard visited the scene, the mangled bodies of the victims and their properties were scattered along the rail track.

Vanguard gathered that traffic officers deployed on the axis by Nigerian Railway Corporation, NRC, had urged the okadaman to wait, but he refused.

The late Inspector Kolo, attached to Inspector-General of Police Monitoring Unit, Force Headquarters, Abuja, was in Lagos on official duty when the incident occurred.

Eyewitness account

According to a fruit vendor, who was at the scene of the incident, "the incident occurred this morning(yesterday)at about 9a.m.

"The okadaman carried a policeman on his bike. While other vehicles and pedestrian stopped near the rail for the approaching train, the okadaman and the officer, who were obviously ignorant of why vehicles were stopped, rode into the rail track. Unfortunately, they
