Cult clash claims one Auchi Poly student

BENIN CITY—CLASH between two rival cult groups, Black Axe, popularly called Aye, and Jurist in the polytechnic community of Auchi, Etsako West Local Government Area of Edo, weekend, claimed one life with another injured and receiving treatment in an undisclosed hospital.

The dead victim is said to be a Disc Jockey, DJ, in Auchi town identified as Sikiru Jeliu.

The two rival cults were said to have had a misunderstanding during the recent final examination of students of Auchi Polytechnic and the clash reportedly led to the death of Jeliu, a student of the polytechnic.

A relative of Jeliu, who narrated the incident, said his brother's killers ensured he died before leaving the scene of the incident.

According to him, "SK (Sikiru), was killed on Saturday night near his house at Iyakpi, South Ibie. His killers gunned him down and took everything he had with him, including his cell phone and necklace.

"He was killed as a result of the clash between Aye and Jurist; another person was shot somewhere in Iyakpi last night,

but was lucky to have survived and presently receiving treatment in an undisclosed hospital."

The relative, who pleaded anonymity, said the family has lodged a formal complain on the

matter to the Police.

When contacted, the state Police Public Relations Officer, DSP Chidi Nwabuzor, said the Command was yet to be briefed on the development in Auchi.
