In new video, ISWAP threatens Army after killing 2 soldiers, policeman in Borno

• As troops rescue 14 women,17 children from insurgents

THE Islamic State of West African Province, ISWAP, has executed two soldiers and a policeman, and vowed to declare war on the Army for interfering with its operations.

This came as the Nigerian Army said, yesterday, it rescued 31 persons, comprising 14 women and 17 children, from insurgents in yet another successful operations launched against terrorists by troops in Borno State

The execution contained in the latest video, dated December 8, released by the group, emerged online, yesterday.

In the video, the execution of the security agents was effected by masked men believed to be members of ISWAP, and those killed were said to have been abducted at a fake checkpoint in Benisheikh, a village 70 kilometres west of Maidugun, Borno State capital.

people were abducted, but the video only showed three tortured security personnel with their hands tied behind their back.

They displayed their identity cards and introduced themselves as a mobile police sergeant, as well as a sergeant and a private soldier of the Nigerian Army.

Before the killing, a masked man in the video backing a niver believed to be around the Lake Chad area spoke in Hausa language.

Threat

He threatened that the group would carry out 'massive attacks' on military formations and ambushes on the highways in the region.

"We are saying to the

soldiers of Nigeria, we will never spare those fighting people practising the religion of Allah. Because of that we shall attack your barracks, wallahi we shall block you on your roads. The story is, what you hear is not what you see; what lies ahead is tougher and uglier than this, Allahu Akbar," he said.

How they were abducted

Shortly before they were killed, the security personnel narrated that they were abducted from a village located few kilometres to Maiduquri.

It was learned that some of the security agents were returning to the theatre of operation after a welfare pass to their base where they had gone to see their families.

Vanguard gathered that following the disbandment of most military checkpoints along the Maiduguri-Damaturu road, the insurgents now mount fake check points dressed in full military regalia.

The criminals also took advantage of the "Operation Positive Identification" exercise through which they identified their victims.

Lastweek, ISWAP had in a statement claimed that it abducted 14 "prisoners" on the same road, six of whom were soldiers, two staff of the Red Cross and six others.

Efforts made to get the reaction of the Army, yesterday, proved futile, as calls made to the telephone of Director of Army Public Relations, Col Sagir Musa, rang out without response.

A text message sent to his phone was also not replied.

Meanwhile, the Nigerian Army said it has rescued 31 persons, including 14 women

and 17 children from terrorists in Borno State.

According to the Army, seven insurgents were also killed, while three others voluntarily surrendered to troops during a fierce operation that saw some terrorists' enclaves completely destroyed and the 31 persons rescued from hideouts of the insurgents.

In a statement signed by Operations Media Coordinator, Col. Aminu Iliyasu, the Army said the search of the terrorists' hideout was conducted by troops of 21 Special Armoured Brigade on December 4, 2019, at Mantari, Malam Masari and Cabchari villages in Bama Local Government Area of Bomo State.

The statement read: "In yet another display of gallantry and patriotism, the combined troops of 68/94 Battalions of Operation Lafiya Dole deployed at Malam Fatori in Abadam LGA of Borno State conducted an aggressive

fighting patrol to a location earlier reported by the Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance, ISR, mission conducted by the Air Task Force of Operation Lafiya Dole as harbouring some activities of the Boko Haram criminal elements.

"The troops successfully uncovered the enclave and proceeded to engage it with devastating volumes of fire. Without any attempt to return fire, the cowardly criminals scampered into the nearby bushes in complete disarray.

"Subsequently, the troops immediately embarked on an exploitation of this success by pursuing them along their withdrawal route.
