## Army troops dislodge ISWAP terrorists, kill top commander, others in Borno, Yobe

AMATURU—THE Nigerian Army troops of Operation Lafiya Dole in conjunction with the Air Task Force have inflicted a heavy blow on Islamic State's West Africa Province, ISWAP terrorists in a failed attempt to infiltrate Damaturu, the Yobe State Capital.

The Nigerian Army Media Operations Coordinator, Col. Aminu Iliyasu, in a statement in Abuja, said the troops engaged the terrorists along Gashua Road in the outskirts of Damaturu in a fire fight with the support of Air Task Force leading to heavy casualty on the side of the terrorists in both men and equipment.

According to him, it was confirmed that a top ISWAP Abu Commander, Mughtar, believed to have coordinated several attacks along the fringes of Lake Chad was neutralised along with over 30 other insurgents in the attack.

According statement, "Regrettably, 2 gallant soldiers were wounded in action during the encounter. The wounded personnel are receiving currently treatment and responding positively at a military medical facility.

"In the aftermath of the encounter, troops captured 7, Iliyasu also informed that one Gun Truck and destroyed two others. Troops equally captured 561 Rounds of 12.7mm ammunition, 1420 Rounds 7.62mm Special ammunition, 1850 Rounds of 7.62 mmX51 ammunition and 2 Rocket Propelled

Gun bombs.
