Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC), Andrew Kumapayi, yesterday, confirmed the death of six people in an accident involving a commercial bus and a truck at the Nkwelle Junction on the Nteie-Onitsha expressway on Sunday.

> Andrew Kumapayi noted that the accident which occurred at about 5:10.p.m. was caused by excessive speeding which led the bus driver to lose control of his vehicle and rammed into the truck.

"The crash involved a mini white bus belonging to a transport firm (name withheld) with registration number BGT313 XA and a white truck which did not display its registration number.

"Out of the 17 persons involved in the crash, 11 male adults sustained some degree of injuries and were rushed to Ivi-Ene Hospital in Ogidi by FRSC rescue team from Nteje Unit Command.

He said the dead were deposited at the hospital's mortuary.
