The Port Harcourt's victim was driving in a Kia Optima car, with number plate, KUJ-713 AR, when he was accosted and shot dead by the assailants at Evo road, Government Reserved Area, GRA. Phase 2, Port Harcourt.

It is was gathered that the killers had trailed him from a bank where he went to withdraw money to the spot before double crossing and shooting him through the car's windscreen.

State Commissioner of Police, Joseph Mukan, who confirmed the development, said the victim was trailed from a bank where he went to withdraw undisclosed amount of money.

Mukan said: "The criminals followed the victim from a bank where he went to withdraw money. While they were chasing him he lost control of the steering and ran into a ditch.

'The criminals met him there and killed him. They did not take the money he withdrew. They were two people in the car when the incident happened. The other person sustained injuries and he is receiving treatment."

## Pharmacist, son escape death in Nsukka auto crash

CYMPATHISERS, yesterday Safternoon, did not believe anyone could survive in an accident that occurred in the university town of Nsukka, Enugu State as a Lexus 350 car was mangled when it was rammed into by a tipper truck.


A pharmacist, who was travelling with his son, said all he heard was a bang on his Lexus 350 car from behind along Ugwunkwo/Enugu road and how he survived was the mercy of God.

The pharmacist, whose full names could not be ascertained at press time, told the surging sympathetic crowd that he was driving from Enugu with his son to Nsukka and at the spot of the accident what he heard was a loud

He said: "I tried to open my door after the accident but it squeezed up. My son opened his side and both of us managed to come go out from there. My car was crushed beyond recognition. Nobody can believe that someone came out of the accident alive.

"Inoticed that there were a trailer, Keke NAPE and a minibus parked along the road. I slowed down to give way for traffic, only for the tipper truck to hit my car from the back and crushed it."

At press time, police, civil defence corps and road safety officers were busy removing wreckage of the car from the road while the truck ditched up in a gutter with its full load of bitumen as the driver fled with conclusion that every occupants of the car died.
