

Arrest killers of IMT student discovered in gutter, Enugu CP charges CID

NSUKKA—THE Enugu State Commissioner of Police, Mohammed Ndatsu Aliyu, on Tuesday, charged the Criminal Investigation Department, CID, of the command to arrest the killers of a young lady identified as Orji Chiamaka Precious.

The remains of the 20-year-old student of Science Laboratory Technology Department, Institute of Management and Technology, IMT, Enugu, was discovered in the early hours of Monday morning in a gutter at the Presidential Road, Independence Layout, Enugu, half naked.

CP Aliyu, in a statement made available to *Vanguard* through the spokesperson of the Command, Daniel Ndukwe, on Tuesday, disclosed that her remains was discovered by operatives attached to New Heaven Police Division, who deposited her body in the morgue for autopsy.

While stating that two persons have been arrested in connection with the incident, he urged all the young people in the state to be mindful of those they go out with to avoid becoming victims of such dastardly act.

Part of the statement read: "The Commissioner of Police, Enugu State Command, CP Mohammed Ndatsu Aliyu,

has ordered the State CID to carry out a full-scale investigation to unravel the circumstances surrounding the death of a young lady, later identified as one Orji Chiamaka Precious Gold aged 20, whose lifeless body was found in the gutter, along Presidential Road, Independence Layout, Enugu.

"Her body was evacuated to the hospital, following information received in the early hours of today, 29th March, 2021 by Police Operatives attached to New Haven Police Division; and was confirmed dead, while the corpse was deposited in the mortuary for preservation and autopsy.

"To this end, the Commissioner has called on young persons in the State to be wary of who they go out with to

avoid becoming victims of such despicable acts. He further enjoins the general public, particularly residents of the State, to assist the Police with useful information that will lead to the arrest and prosecution of the assailants.

"Meanwhile, two persons have been arrested and are being investigated to ascertain their culpability or otherwise in the death of the young lady.
