Lagos tanker explosion: 5 lives lost, 25 vehicles burnt; hoodlums loot offices, vandalise property

The tanker reportedly

explored while in motion at about 10.32 pm on at about 10.32 pm on Thursday According to cycwinesses the impact of the explosion was fell inside buildings in the Government Residential Area (GRA) axis of Ikeja.

The Acting Zonal Coordinator, South West Zonal Office, National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA), Mr Ibrahim Facinloye, Ibrahim Farinloye, confirmed that live persons had so fer lost their lives in the fire incident. Farinloye said yesterday that three bodies were

earlier recovered from the scene of the incident by emergency response agencies. "Sadly two out of the 13 persons who were rescued and taken to the Treums and Bums Centre at Ghagada General Hospital, passed on a few minutes ago. This makes it a total of five persons killed in the explosion so lar," he

He said the explosion was alleged to have been caused by leakage while the liquested petroleum gas (LPG) tanker was in motion.

According to him. "the resulting lire travelled with the wind to the premises of Ogun State Property Investment Company (OPIC) Plaza besides Sheraton Hotels, which houses different commercial outlist including a Chinese Restaurant. The fire was put out at about 12.30

Menagement Agency Response Unit. The initial scamb and rescue activities revealed that 13 persons sessioned various degrees of barrs. Out of this, nine are males, while four are females. We have so far recovered three bodies from the incident. The bodies were recovered from the generator house of OPIC Plaza and the OPIC Plaza and the restaurant.

Many workers of the restaurant were trapped in the inferno and their should be abled. for help attracted people like us who rushed to the scene to rescue them. Unfortunately, we could not do much because of thick chocking snoke.

We had to use a torch light to ascertain the exact location of trapped people only to notice that such assistance would require the services of an ambulance.

"We ran to Eko Hospital for support but were referred to the General Hospital and this process was cumbersome and could not be completed. The fire rayaged the more. Men of the fire service then arrived the scene and swung into action. Enurgency services arrived for hours later but without ambulance service. This is pathetic," he lamented.

Maanwhile, a businessman, Mr Soun Poters, has decried the looting of his office by hoodings during the incident which damaged part of Ogun State Proporty Investment Company (OPIC) Plaza, in Ikeja. Peters, the Managing Director, Rolling Video Games, told the News Agency of Nigeria (NAN) on Friday that his company, located in the plaza, sulfored several losses due to the incident.

Peters said: "Three of my official vehicles were burnt and the heedlums tried to break into my van and my office was looted. I wonder why, because if there is a fire incident. I don't know why people will now use that opportunity to try to loot offices and shops. I think they should stop this dangerous trend when places are burning, rather than look for a solution to the boodlums try. to take that opportunity to loot." He said the office was vandalised by the boodlums who carled away some cash, electronic padgets and wristwatches.
