WERRI—APEX Igbo so co-cultural group, Ohanaeze Ndigbo, yesterday, raised the alarm over the renewed violent attacks in Imo and the bizzare practice of beheading victims

Just vesterday in Okporo and neighbouring communities in Orlu Local Government Area of Imo State, there was re-newed violence and a com-munity leader whose identity has not been made known was beheaded and his head placed on a table around the market in Okporo communi

The number of beheaded persons in the Orlu area has risen to five since this renewed violence started.

The apex group appealed to those behind the attacks to sheath their swords.

This came as the Imp State Police Command yesterday, said a 15-year-old boy, Em-manuel Nnaji, a native of Awala in Ideato South Local Government Area of Imo State, was the one who led the police tactical team to a hotel in Orlu Local Government, from where attacks were planned and executed in Omuma, Oru East Local Government and Njaba Police station in the state.

In a related development, the Abia state government has lamented an alleged plot to attack and kidnap prominent persons in the state.

Gunmen escalate violence

Besides beheading a community leader in Imo in the recent attacks, over twenty shops were also completely razed and vehicles numbering more than ten got burnt. A shop where caskets were sold was also burnt including the already constructed cas-kets waiting for potential cus-

Vanguard gathered from Orlu that the attacks which started on Sunday night continued till Monday morning. At the time of filing this re-

port, the reason for the attack was not yet known but resi-dents linked it to the hardened criminal gang as well as na-tive doctors that operate freely at night.

In another development, another group of gunmen dressed in security attire set ablaze a hotel owned by Chinonso Uba in the area. In the attack, two trucks were set ablaze. One of the trucks was loaded with alcoholic drinks.

According to an eyewitness, the gunmen stormed the hotel with two Hilux vehicles, Mercedes 360 and an armoured car. They also burnt a brand new HighLander car

belonging to Uba."

A community source who spoke to Vanguard from Orlu said: "My brother, this is what we have been seeing since Sunday. Orlu is getting hot now. We are no longer sleep-These criminals move freely in the night and they kill

and destroy everything.
"Even this Monday moming, we heard of strange movements by these men in Okporo community and peo-Okporo community and peo-ple started running. What is happening in Orlu is creating fears everywhere. These crim-inals started with the beheadmais started with the beneating of our people's homes.
What do they want?
"When will all these attacks end. We are suffering in Orlu

15-year-old boy exposed hotel where ESN plan attacks on Njaba, Omuma —Police

The Imo State Police Com-missioner, Abutu Yaro, spoke in Owern while parading over twenty suspected members of the Eastern Security Network, ESN, who were arrested at the said hotel in Orlu. Yaro said seven females were among those arrested.

It was said that the hotel vas where a victim was beheaded by the suspects and the head placed along the road. Also, the ESN members were arrested with Army camou-flage uniforms, arms, and

ammunition.
The police said they discov ered that the owner of the said hotel accommodated and gave financial support to the ESN members as a base from where they launched attacks

"Sequel to the recent attack on Omuma Police Station and Njaba Police Station respectively, the bandits were swiftly repelled by the tacti-cal team of Imo State Police Command. We lost a Divi-sional Police Officer and arrested one of the bandits. Emmanuel Nnaji, 15, a native of Awala in Ideato South LGA of Imo State with bullet wounds and brought him to the station.

"On interrogation by the command's tactical teams, the suspect gave a vivid de-scription of a Hotel located in Orlu where the bandits stayed and planned before they executed their dastardly act on the police stations.

The owner of the hotel has been accommodating and assisting them financially. He then volunteered and led security forces to the location of the hotel. On arrival, the hotel and the house were cordoned off and searched. Exhibits were recovered from the arrested twenty-six suspects including seven females.

"It was in the same hotel that the head of a young man was severed and placed on the road close to the hotel premises. Presently, investigation is ongoing and the suspects are undergoing interroga-

The Police said it "recalled that in the same Orlu some months ago during the peak of IPOB/ESN attacks and killing of Police officers includ-ing innocent citizens and

burning of Police stations in the state: that the command's tactical teams and forces arrested one Boniface Okeke, aged 57 years from Obor Autonomous Community in Orlu LGA of Imo State in connection with attacks on security agencies and private individuals.

"While we strongly admon-ish those behind the dastardly plot to desist from it, we ad-vise such high profile personalities mentioned above to exercise utmost vigilance while going about their nor-mal duties as security agents in the country are on the trail of the arrowheads of the plot to nip it in the bud and bring those involved to justice.

peals to all citizens and visiors to keep their focus on tors to keep their focus on maintaining the existing peace in the state and avoid acts that are capable of reversing the gains we have made collectively in securing the state through the understanding and cooperation of all."
