

# Military kills 3 suspected hoodlums attacking Imo communities

• Police kill 4 suspected bandits in Ogun, Delta

THE Nigeria joint military operation in Imo State yesterday killed three suspected hoodlums terrorising some communities in Ngor Okpala Local Government Area of Imo State.

This came as police killed four suspected bandits during gun battles in with police operatives in Ogun and Delta states.

The killing of the three suspected hoodlums in Imo State was confirmed when the Commander 34 Artillery Brigade, Owerri, Brigadier General Raymond Utsaha, led other commanders on the spot assessment around Umunwanyewere Umunwanya community of Ngor Okpala Local Government Area where the bloody clash took place between the military and hoodlums and how to track them.

An intelligence officer said: "The armed hoodlums were busy enforcing the street-home order forcing people to close their businesses in the various communities, collecting their valuables."

Three of the hoodlums were killed by the military and an SUV Toyota Rav4 was recovered from them. They started snatching vehicles from Imeneawa.

"One of the suspects, who later died gave the military vital information on the location of others suspects including those who sustained gunshot injuries. He gave his name as Chigbo Odumegwu, a native of Umudihi Opasanim community in Ahiazu Mbaise local government."

statement, yesterday, said: "The divisional patrol team from Otu-Jeremi police station, which started received information that four suspected armed robbers, who had earlier snatched two

vehicles, a gold-coloured Toyota Camry with number plate PSN 291 AW and a custom coloured Lexus SUV with number plate WWR 737 ML, abandoned the vehicles at Otuokwu community due to suspected mechanical faults and were camping in a motorcycle."

The team sprung into action and chased the hoodlums but the gang, in sight of the police team opened fire on them and in the ensuing gun battle, the hoodlums were forced to abandon the tricycle. Two of the hoodlums escaped and ran into the bush while two others were fatally wounded and found in the tricycle with a crushed tricycle. One AK-47 rifle with a breach number not visible, an empty magazine, a cash sum of N100,000 and gold jewellery were recovered.

## Diarrhoea: 35 dead, 150 hospitalised in Borno

CHAIRMAN of Gwoza Local Government Area in Borno, Prof Ibrahim Bakar has announced that about 35 people have died with 150 others hospitalised following the outbreak of diarrhoea and vomiting in Gwoza.

Bakar made this known, yesterday, in Maiduguri while speaking at an interactive session with stakeholders in border communities, organised by Borno State Boundary Commission in collaboration with the National

Bakar, who did not give details, explained that the outbreak started weekend, adding that such developments pose challenges being faced by border communities due to the lack of health and other facilities, saying the amenities were destroyed by insurgents.

"General Hospital, clinics, Customs and Immigration houses, water and all other property in the border communities have been destroyed," Bakar said.

He called for the provision of health

facilities in border areas to prevent border communities from travelling to neighbouring countries for medical treatment and other services.

He said: "Provision of clean water supply in all border communities is a top priority. Water related diseases will be avoided when clean water is supplied to border communities."

"This is very necessary because most sources of water in the destroyed border communities have been polluted with corpses, chemicals and fire retardant, hence they are not good for human consumption."
