5 dead, 7 injured in Lagos-Ibadan expressway, Niger auto crashes

OGERE—FOUR persons died while six others sustained varying degrees of injuries in an accident involving a Mazda bus and a truck on the Iperu bridge, Ogere on the Lagos-Ibadan expressway.

Also in a related incident, yesterday, one person died and one other sustained injury in a lone accident in Gwaba village of Tafa Local

Government Area of Niger State.

Mr Ahmed Umar, the Sector Commander, Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) in Ogun, who confirmed this to newsmen in Abeokuta, yesterday, said: "The accident occurred this morning (Tuesday) at about 6:25 a.m. Involved a Mazda bus with number plate YYY 412 XB and an unregistered truck.

"The Mazda bus driver, who was at high speed, crashed into the moving truck from behind due to a slight defect on the truck.

"A male child was among the dead. The injured victims were taken to the Victory Hospital, Ogere for medical attention while the deceased have been deposited at the FOS Morgue, Ipara.

In the Niger State Accident, FRSC

Sector Commander, Mr Kumar Tsukwam, who confirmed the incident in Minna, said the bus involved was loaded with bags of kolanuts.

Tsukwam said that three people were involved in the lone accident that claimed a life, one injured and one unhurt in the accident which occurred on July 26 at about 08:30 a.m. on Abuja-Kaduna road at Gwaba village.
