K ADUNA-Gunmen, Tuesday night in Manchok, Kaduna State, killed Mr Daniel Yatai, the lather of Philip Yatai, a correspondent of the News Agency of Nigeria (NAN) and abducted his niece, Brenda
It was gathered that they
also abducted Mr Amos
Manhon Booton of Frances Magbon, Rector of Federal School of Statistics, Manchok, in Kaura Local Government of the state.

The victim, Mr Daniel Yatai, 86, retired from the Nigeria Railway Corporation in 1991

The second child of the victim, who witnessed the sad event, Ms Christiana Yatai, said the gunmen came to the house at about 11:15 pm.

She said: "We were five in the house; myself, my dad, my mum, two of my niece and a

nephew.

"They asked us to open the door and when we refused, they broke the main entrance and gained access to the house.

"My father was in his room and one of them wearing a mask, who was outside, shot him through the window and the bullet hit him from the back. Those who entered the house later went to his room and finished him up.

"They went away with one of my nieces, Ms Brenda Friday, 21, a final year student of Kaduna State College of Education, Gidan Waya."

Another child of the deceased, Mr Joseph Yatai, said the gunmen had contacted the family and demanded N15 million to release the girl.

Similarly, the brother to the ctor, Innocent Magbon, said the nmen had also reached out to e family to ask for a N15m
