## 4 killed over disputed land in C/River community

MALABAR A disputed family land at Odupkani Effiwat community Odukpani Local Government G Area of Cross River State has claimed the lives of four

people.

The victims: Effiom Eyamba. 55; Samuel Eyamba, 35; Etiong Eyamba, 22 and Ekpeyong Ekpeyong, were reportedly killed by persons suspected to be rival family members over the disputed

They were allegedly forced to ingest herbicide after a thorough beating over the disputed parcel of land, which also encapsulated a palm estate.

Obed Eyamba, who det demanded justice, said he lost wh three of his brothers and their friend who accompanied them on the journey,

Also, the mother of one of the Marta Mrs deceased, Ekpeyong, said her 35-yearold son, Ekpeyong, who had been a childhood friend to the Evambas, never came back home since June 27.

She said she received the shocking news when she heard that he was killed Oki alongside his friends whom he onti accompanied to the village.

**She appe**aled to the Police, Attorney-General and The Commissioner for Justice in Cross River State to assist her as she had no one to get I justice for her.

Cross River State Deputy Police Public Relations Officer, DSP Ewa Igri, who also confirmed the killings said six persons had been arrested in connection with the deaths.

The police spokesperson, however, called for patience while the police conclude the investigation on the matter.
