septuagenarian, Chief Shedrack Orikoha It was gathered that the masked killers invaded the community in the early hours on Friday and murdered one Ewor Orlkoha in the community. Orikoha in the community.

It was learned that members of a cult group.

on reprisal had invaded Akabta under heavy gunfire and carried out the attack.

It was further gathered that the killers, who arrived the community about 12 am had made straight to the home of Ewor, member of the ONELGA Security Planning and Advisory Committee, held him hostage for minutes before shooting him dead.
A source in the community,

a relative of the victim (names withheld for security reasons) told Saturday Vanguard that killers were more than seven.

The source narrated that the killers first of all killed Ewor, the vigilante member, left the compound and returned minutes later to abduct Chief Shedrack.

He said: "Last night, some cult boys came into our community. They killed one of my uncles, Ewor. He was a member of OSPAC.

"They met him at his house late in the night. He came back home and he never knew that the boys were around. Immediately he opened his door, they followed him him.'

The source disclosed that the hoodlums had invaded the family of Orikoha some minutes after the killing and abducted a government recognized Chief, Orikoha.

He said: "As I speak, my

He said: "As I speak, my people are living in fear. We need government to give secuity attention. They have not killed somebody in this community before. "The boys came back to the compound again after they killed Ewor. They kidnapped our Chief. He is a titled chief. Chief Shedrack Orikoha, Till now, we don't know his whereabouts." whereabouts."

However, at press time, the spokesperson of the Rivers State Police Command, Grace Iringe-Koko, a Superintendent of Police, could not confirm the
