Shortly after the market, every one will return to their homes and celebrate the day with local palm wine under the shed usually located in the central of the town.

Unknowingly to the people of the community, this particular Thursday had hidden in its belly, sorrows, gnashing of teeth and wailing waiting to unfold just a the waiting to unfold, just at the closing time of the market, around 4pm, a loud shout from a particular section in the town enveloped the entire community, making the traders to hurriedly pack their wares and rushed toward the direction the of loud wailing.

What they saw befuddled them, a dead boy lying in the pool of his own blood, a dane gun placed carelessly on the ground near another weeping teenager, rolling on the floor, unable to explain the calamity

that attracted the onlookers.

Vanguard gathered that a teenage son of a local hunter and community security guard had snuffed the life out of his playmate and friend, Adewale Ajayi, a JSS 2 student of Erijiyan Community High School over alleged plan to test a charm known in local parlance as "ayeta" laced on the deceased.

The unfortunate incident which threw the entire community into mourning occurred at a popular street called Eyon-Ogbe quarter in the ancient community.

According to a source from the community, the father of the suspect, who was a local hunter and a private security guard in charge of the ancient community, had on the fateful day placed his dane gun at the corner of the house shortly after returning from the day's work.

The late teenager had accompanied the victim, who was said to be a good friend of the suspect to the house, picked the dane gun where it was kept at the corner of the

house and was said to have demonstrated and tested the gun before he allegedly shot the victim to death.

The victim was said to have been found in the pool of his blood after being shot by the suspect when some people in the community arrived the scene of the incident.

As at the time of filling this report, the source disclosed that the suspect and his father are currently detained at the Aramoko divisional police station, while the corpse of the victim had been deposited at the Morgue in an undisclosed Hospital in the area.
