

Motorcyclist arrested with human parts in Ondo

AKURE—Police detectives in Ondo State have arrested a motorcyclist, Abdullahi Jose, for being in possession of human parts.

Abdullahi reportedly fled the scene after policemen stopped him at Ikare Akoko area of the state, during a stop-and-search exercise.

Vanguard gathered that the suspect abandoned his motorcycle on sighting the policemen at the check point.

After he abandoned his motorcycle and fled into the bush, police detectives, during a search discovered the human part.

Two human hands and other parts were recovered by the police detectives.

The suspect was later arrested in Okene, Kogi State, where he fled to, by police detectives from the state command acting on intelligence report.

Contacted, the state police command spokesperson, Funmi Odunlami, confirmed the arrest of the suspect, saying the suspect was apprehended in Kogi State with the use of modern technology.

In another development, three persons have been arrested and paraded over passport racketeering.

The suspects, Etaoghere Cyril, Okunika Joy and Adehaka Blessing, were arrested by the officials of the Nigeria Immigration Service, NIS, Ondo State Command Passport Office.

Parading the suspects, the command's spokesperson, Oladapo Bayode, said the suspects charge N80,500 for a 32-page five years validity passport, N100,500 for 64 pages for five years validity passport, and N165,000 for 64 pages, 10 years validity passport which is against the widely publicised cost of passport on the NIS official website.

Bayode said their arrest followed series of complaints that some elements in the society still capitalize on the previous lapses in passport administration to dupe unsuspecting members of the public of their hard-earned money.
